 6 October 2011: Draft legislative package for Cohesion Policy 2014 - 2020 adopted by European Commission



- European Territorial Cooperation continued and reinforced as separate cohesion goal
- 18 December 2012: future transnational programme areas → To assist the implementation of macro-regional strategies to ensure a consistent approach between them
- Present area of South East Europe Programme covered in 2014-2020 by 2 transnational programmes: Danube and South East Gateway (renamed Adriatic-Ionian) → To support the development and implementation of 2 Macro Regional Strategies: Danube and Adriatic-Ionian Regions
- Recent third programme: Balkan-Mediterranean

- 83.4 MFUR FRDF
- 15.7 MEUR IPA
- ➡ First half 2015: Programme and first call launch
- National co-financing: 15%






