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ETC 2014-2020

- 6 October 2011: Draft legislative package for Cohesion Policy 2014 - 2020 adopted by European Commission



- European Territorial Cooperation continued and reinforced as separate cohesion goal
- 18 December 2012: future transnational programme areas → To assist the implementation of macro-regional strategies to ensure a consistent approach between them
- **Present area of South East Europe Programme covered in 2014-2020 by 2 transnational programmes: Danube and South East Gateway (renamed Adriatic-Ionian) → To support the development and implementation of 2 Macro Regional Strategies: Danube and Adriatic-Ionian Regions**
- **Recent third programme: Balkan-Mediterranean**

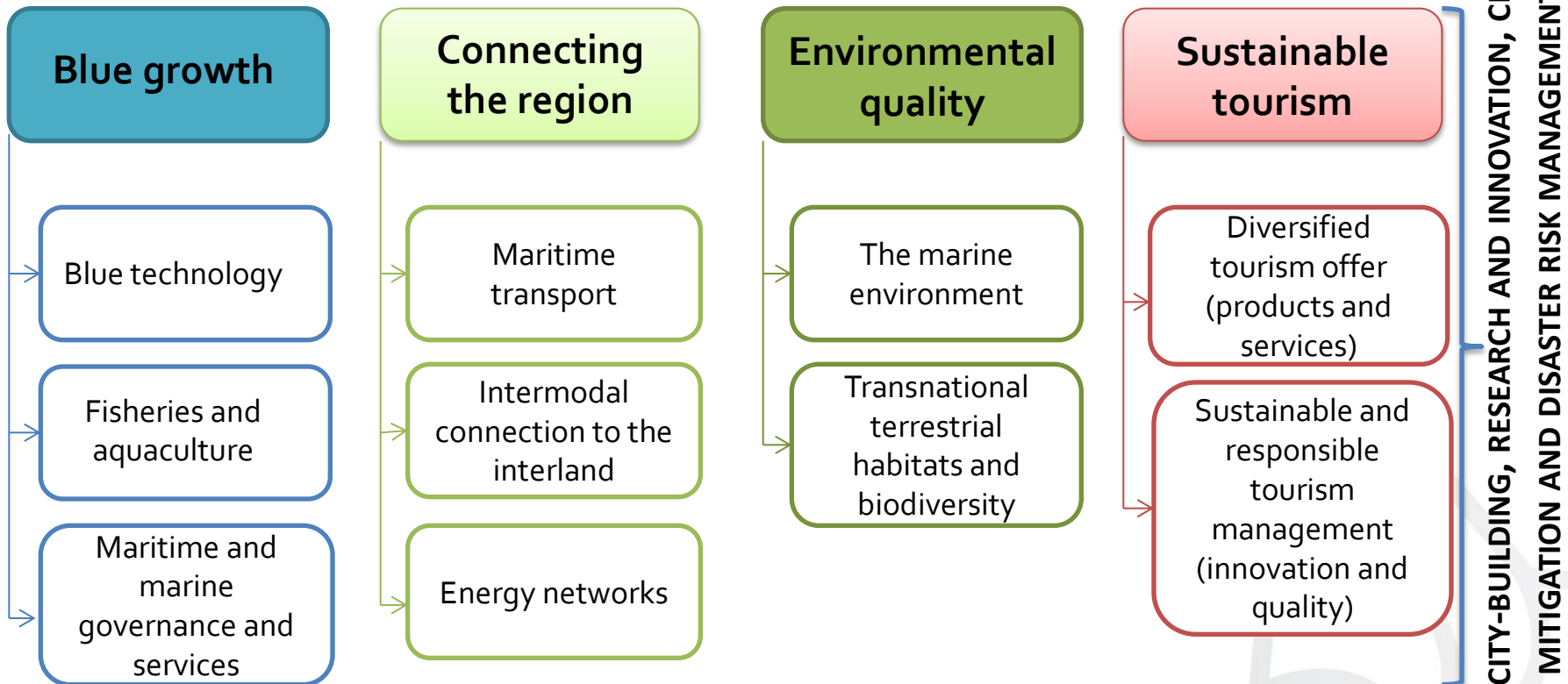
Adriatic Ionian Programme

- ➔ EC communication of 02/08/2013
 - › adjusted to EUSAIR territory:
 - › from South East Gateway (12/2012)
- ➔ Ensure coherence with the EU macro-regional strategy
- ➔ MA / JS in Bologna (Italy)
- ➔ Budget: 99 MEUR
 - 83.4 MEUR ERDF
 - 15.7 MEUR IPA
- ➔ First half 2015: Programme and first call launch
- ➔ National co-financing: 15%

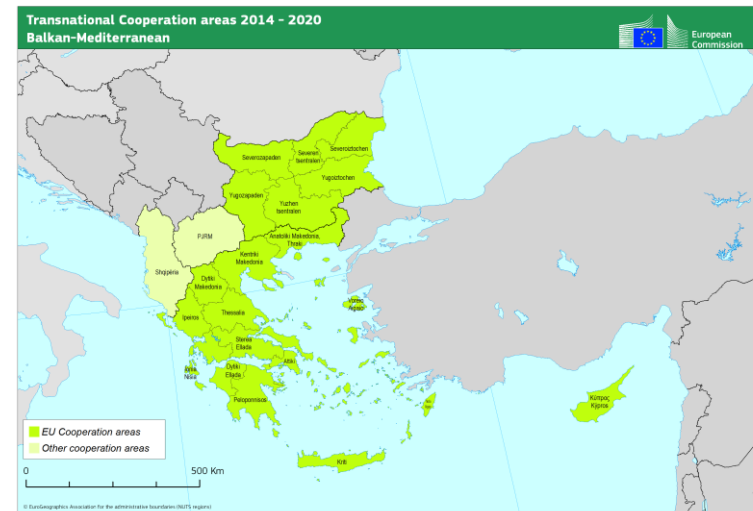

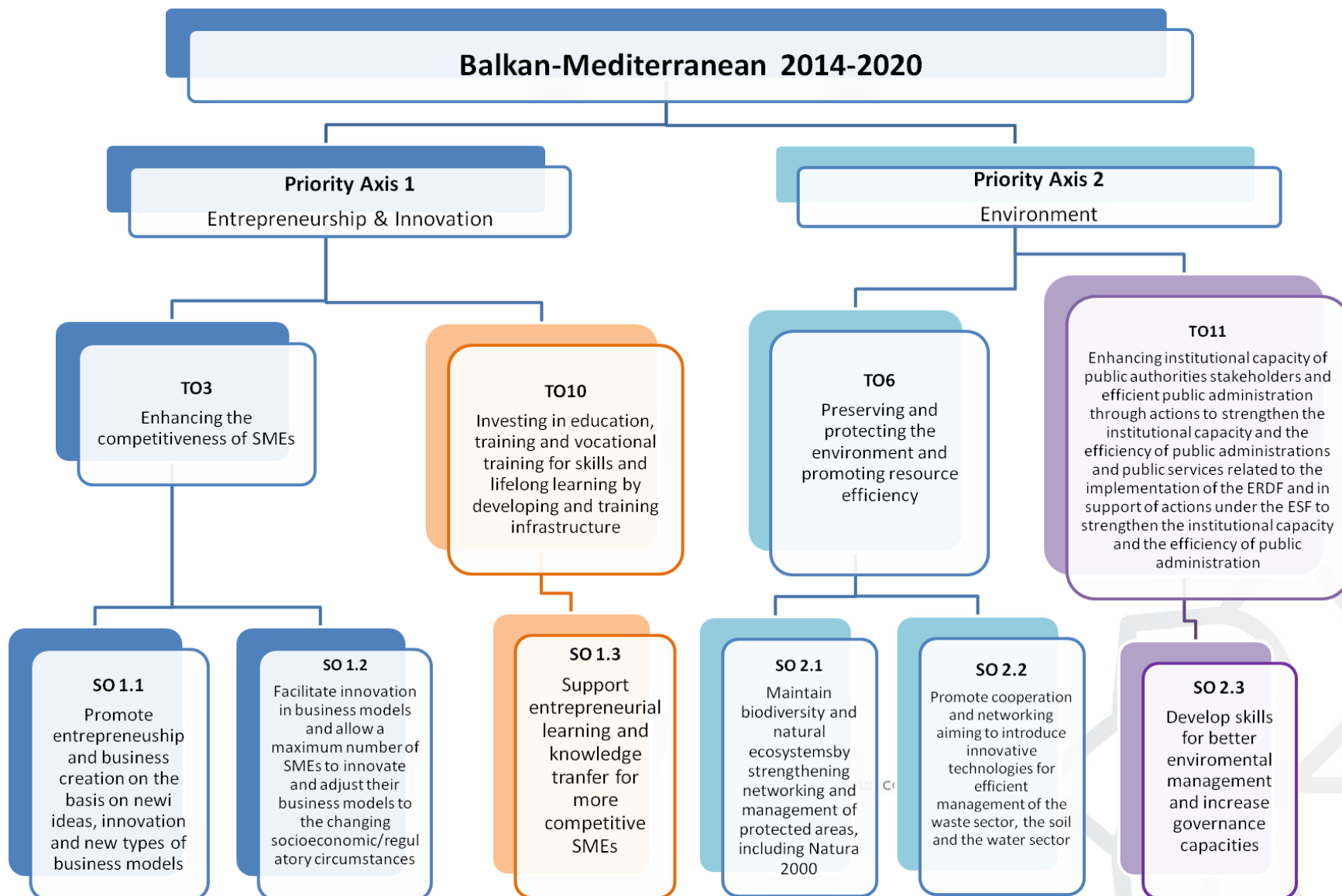

- ➔ EC communication of 19/12/2013
 - › Initiative of GR and some SEE partner states
- ➔ MA/JS location: Thessaloniki (Greece)
- ➔ Budget: 39.727.652,11 EUR
 - 28.3 MEUR ERDF
 - 5.1 MEUR IPA
- ➔ First half 2015: Programme and first call launch
- ➔ National co-financing: 15%

Danube Transnational Programme

- ➔ Support the development and implementation of Danube EU Macro Regional Strategy
- ➔ MA / JS location: Budapest (HU)
- ➔ Budget: 263 MEUR
 - 202 MEUR ERDF
 - 19.8 MEUR IPA
- ➔ First half 2015: Programme and first call launch
- ➔ National co-financing: 15%
